# **RESOLUTION**

# Authorizing the Establishment of a Mayor's Youth Council for the City of Laurel

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of Laurel, Mississippi, recognizes the vital role that youth play in shaping the future of our community; and

**WHEREAS,** it is the desire of the City Council to actively engage young people in civic matters, leadership development, and community-building initiatives; and

**WHEREAS**, the creation of a Mayor's Youth Council will provide a formal structure for local youth to contribute their voices, ideas, and talents to city governance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of Laurel, Mississippi, as follows:

### Section 1: Establishment

The Mayor's Youth Council is hereby established as a student-led body dedicated to empowering youth and promoting their involvement in civic affairs.

### Section 2: Purpose

The purpose of the Mayor's Youth Council shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Enabling members to understand and experience local government
- 2. Developing leadership skills and civic responsibility among members
- 3. Acting as a liaison between the city's youth and local government

### Section 3: Operations

The Mayor's Youth Council shall operate independently without reliance on a city budget. Mayor's Youth Council members will take full responsibility for planning, organizing, and executing their initiatives with guidance from the Mayor and other community mentors as needed.

# Section 4: Membership

Members of the Mayor's Youth Council will consist of  $9^{th} - 12^{th}$  grade students enrolled in a local high school or homeschool, in good standing within their school and community. There will be two (2) students appointed from each City ward and members will serve a maximum of two (2) years.

### Section 4: Effective Date

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage by the City Council.
