It is the responsibility of the Inspection Department to notify property owners of any complaints and/or city ordinance violation(s) in regard to your property. It is the department's mandate that violations be handled in a timely manner. A public hearing to obtain a council order to clean, demo or secure the property or parcel of land, and the cost will be assessed to the tax payer I.D. (parcel) number associated with the property taxes has been set.

At 5:30<sup>pm</sup> on September 3, in the Council Chambers at City Hall is set as the date, time and place of public hearing to determine whether or not the above-described property is in such a state of uncleanliness, dilapidated state or in need of securing, so as to be a menace to the public health and safety of the community.

An adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the municipality to re-enter the property or parcel of land for a period of two (2) years for uncleanliness, overgrown, and household furniture; and one (1) year for unsecure and dilapidated properties after final adjudication without any further hearing if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is re-entered for cleaning.
